Each year, judges from Commissioner King's office and the Georgia Fire Sprinkler Association review essay submissions for Fire Safety Awareness Week. This year's theme was in line with the National Fire Protection Association's mission of "Serving Up Fire Safety in the Kitchen."

Winners in this year's contest were students at Colquitt Christian Academy in Moultrie, Gray Elementary School in Gray, Saint Thomas More Catholic School in Decatur, Murdock Elementary School in Marietta, Our Lady of Assumption Catholic School in Atlanta, King's Chapel Elementary School in Perry, St. Benedict's Episcopal School in Smyrna, and Southwest Laurens Elementary School in Rentz,

"Teachers and students across urban, suburban, and rural Georgia showed a real desire to serve up fire safety in the kitchen," said Commissioner King. "Especially since elementary schoolers form lifelong habits at such a young age, I am thrilled to see these students already understand the importance of fire safety in the kitchen."

Each winner receives a fire prevention gift basket. The grand prize winner from Colquitt Christian Academy received a gift basket and a cash prize.
