TURNER COUNTY HOME FIRE RULED ARSON

ATLANTA – The Office of Insurance and Safety Fire Commissioner John F. King announced today that a fire at 646 South Main Street in Ashburn has been ruled an arson. The fire occurred around 3:30 a.m. on Wednesday, November 11.

"Our State Fire Investigations Unit received a call for assistance from our partners at the Ashburn Fire Department on Wednesday morning," said Commissioner King. "Our investigator discovered that this 1,500-square-foot, 70-year-old home was intentionally set on fire and the fire was started in a rear storage area."

Commissioner King's State Fire Investigations Unit, the Asburn Fire Department, and other local authorities are continuing this investigation.
